Nun and Mim with Shaddah (When The Letter is Doubled)

- **Composition:** A doubled letter is originally composed of two letters: The first letter has no vowel (harakah) while the latter has a vowel. The first letter is merged into the second so they become a single letter that is pronounced for the length of two letters. (نُّ = نَ + نُ).
- **Location:** The nun and mim with shaddah can occur in the middle or at the end of a word. They occur in nouns, verbs, or prepositions.
- **Rule:** Obligatory to pronounce the ghunnah very clearly with izh-har. It is called “ghunnah mushadaddah” (a doubled letter with ghunnah).
- **Model Examples:**

The Doubled Letter	Example of the Letter in the Middle of the word	Example of the Letter at the End of a Word
النون Nun	وَيُمْنِيهِمْ	إِنَّ
الميم Mem	أُمَّتُكُمْ	نَمَّ
